How can AI-tools be made more accessible for SciLifeLab group leaders and the Data-Driven research community? Discussions are ongoing with NAISS and Sunet. 5	<p>DDLS financial update and phase 3 activities (See presentation “June 10_DDLS SG”, page 32 - 44 for details)</p> <p><i>Presentation of financial status and a 10-year forecast (2025 – 2035) was provided. The preparation and planning of the phase 3 application and budget for phase 3 were reviewed. 6	<p>Update from Data Centre (DC) (See presentation “June 10_DDLs SG”, page 45 – 62 for details)</p> <p><i>An update was provided on the ongoing work with the Data Science Nodes and the implementation of the Integrated Data Service (IDS) across all infrastructures at SciLifeLab. DC has been assigned to coordinate and lead two projects: the development of a User and Project Portal (in collaboration with OO) and a Sample Tracking System. In addition, DC will coordinate the dialogue with NAISS and other national e-infrastructures in Sweden and will organize internal communication and planning within SciLifeLab regarding IT and e-infrastructure needs.</i></p> <p><i>DC currently meets with all new DDLs Fellows to present the available data services after they have started their positions. The DDLs Steering Group discussed the potential benefits of offering prospective fellow candidates the opportunity to meet with DC prior to accepting their positions. This would allow candidates to gain insight into the broader data services available beyond their host universities. It was suggested that this offer could be extended to the recruitment committees for consideration.</i></p>	<p><i>Presenter:</i> <i>Johan Rung</i></p>
7	<p>Update from WABI (See presentation “June 10_DDLs SG”, page 63 – 88 for details)</p> <p><i>Presentation of WABI support, the support teams, WABI staff and publications from PI’s connected to WABI. For the Phase 3 planning WABI wants to:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>• Continue to decrease volume of staff (target ~20 FTE at start of phase 4: SU grant ending)</i> <i>• Improve mechanisms to leverage WABI-supported projects into tools and data services in collaborative efforts by utilizing resources across the DDLs program and the SciLifeLab platforms Integrated Data Services initiative.</i> <i>• Scale up mentoring efforts?</i> <p><i>Guidelines on competence profiles for WABI replacement positions at two Data Science Nodes (EBI + EB) are needed. While advertisements for the new recruitments are prepared, there is a question as to whether these should be postponed until the roles of the Data Science Nodes have been redefined.</i></p> <p><i>It was suggested that the recruitment strategy might instead focus on addressing existing gaps in data services, regardless of the specific research focus of each node. 8	<p>Research School - Update Postdoc Program (See presentation “June 10_DDLS SG”, page 89 – 95 for details)</p> <p>The newly appointed Research school Director for the postdoc program, Lukas Käll shared his visions and ideas of the process and design of the postdoc program. Some main questions are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Who do we want to recruit? • Project- or person-centered recruitment? • Training/education packages? • What is the unique selling point of this program? • How do we ensure broad visibility and a diverse pool of applicants? <p>The duration of the positions was discussed. A 3-year position could be possible by combining a 2-year DDLS funding and additional support by the PI. Also, it was discussed that a person-centered recruitment could mean that the postdocs could formulate their project together with a PI (before projects are finally selected). However, long-term previous work in the same group or transition from a PhD role in the same group to a postdoc is not appropriate.</p> <p>Could industrial postdocs be connected to start-ups?</p>	<p>Presenter: Lukas Käll</p>

There is a need for a new member representing RA CMB and replacing Lukas Käll who is now assigned to a Research school director role for the postdoc program. • The DDLS Research school curriculum structure that was discussed at SG meeting no. 40, 250424 has now been decided by the RSMG. • The recruitment of PhDs granted in the DDLS PhD project call 2024 is ongoing and a total of 7 positions out of 26 have been filled. • The call for DDLS RS courses in 2025 received 12 proposals and the decisions will be made by RSMG in August. • The next annual PhD school meeting will be held 17-20 March 2026 	<p>Presenters: Olof Emanuelsson, Peetra Magnusson</p>

11	<p>Update about RDCP processes and the role of RDCPs</p> <p><i>The applicants for the four RDCP Expression of Interest applications approved by the SciLifeLab Board (Meeting No. 78, 2021-05-25) have been informed of the expected revisions to their proposals. Final project applications will be approved by the Chair of the SciLifeLab Board.</i></p> <p><i>The Steering Group discussed the formal reporting structure for the RDCPs, including whether they should report to the Research Area Leads. Given that some RDCPs are relevant to more than one specific DDLS research area, the DDLS Steering Group discussed that it might be more appropriate for the RDCPs to report directly to the DDLS Steering Group, but keep the RAs informed about their plans and progress.</i></p> <p><i>All RDCPs will be required to submit an annual report to the DDLS Steering Group and to present their progress at the DDLS Annual Conference.</i></p>	<p><i>Presenter:</i> <i>Olli Kallioniemi</i></p>
